The 1977 Girls' JV Basketball team had a 6-13 overall record. The Bears were 3-3 in the M.S.A.C. Conference. The team consisted of two sophomores and 12 freshmen. The Ashley JV's averaged 18.6 a game but gave up 25.3 points a game. The teams' leading offensive player was Cindy Plesko. She led the team in points (70), shooting percentage (30%), rebounds (100), free throw percentage (41%). The leading defensive player was Kathi Burlingame with 37 steals. Kathi always drew the other teams' best offensive player to defense. The biggest hurdle for the JV's was in the turnovers department where they committed an average of 30 turnovers a game. Another problem the team had was in the way of injuries and sickness. There were only two games all season in which all 14 team members were able to play.
