







The season started with optimism having six seniors in the starting line-up, and a pitching staff that had a successful 1981 season. The early problems was with the pitching, then came some fielding problems, and at the end of the season the Bears had some hitting problems. The season ended with a 7-1 loss in pre-districts to Sacred Heart with a record of 11-7 and the Bears ended up in second place in the Mid-State Athletic Conference with a 5-3 record.

A number of players had good seasons for the Bears they were: Mike Zimmerman who batted .557 and had 5 wins pitching, Buddy Howes who batted .444 and supplied the power for the Bears, John Mills batted .390 and Randy Stehlik hit .322.

The following records were broken: Best season average Zimmerman .557, most hits in a season 34 Zimmerman, most singles in a season 24 Zimmerman, most runs scored in a season 32 Zimmerman, most doubles in a season 8 Buddy Howes, most home runs in a season 5 Howes, most RBI's in a season 29 Howes.

Honors went to Mike Zimmerman who was the MVP and Buddy Howes who was the MIP for 1982. Zimmerman and Howes were voted to the first team MSAC squad and Randy Stehlik received a honorable mention. Both Zimmerman and Howes were voted to the all Region IV team in 1982.
