
The Bears offense was led by Senior quarterback Buddy Howes who completed 126 of 226 passes for an outstanding total of 1369 yards. He also led the rushing department with 234 yards.

Senior end Wade Crumbaugh was the Bears main receiver who caught 47 passes for 601 yards for the season.

The Bears defense was led by Joe Yelsik, a Senior linebacker, who had an amazing 108 tackles for the year.

Four Seniors received recognition from the MSAC All Conference team. Crumbaugh was selected on the first team All Conference squad as an offensive and defensive end while Howes was choosen as the first team quarterback. Mills made honorable mention on offense and defense while Yelsik made honorable mention on defense. Howes was also choosen as the AP All State quarterback and on the second team quarterback on the All Lansing Area. Crumbaugh received honorable mention as a defensive end.

The MVP trophy was awarded to Buddy Howes and the MIP trophy was awarded to Jason Custer at the Fall Athletic Banquet.
