NHS Induction

This year the National Honor Society inducted eight new members: one senior, one sophomore, and six juniors. The first step to becoming an NHS member is to meet the scholarship requirement of at least a 3.5 grade point average. Then the chosen students are evaluated in the areas of service, leadership, and character. All four categories are of equal importance. The teachers then vote on the qualifying candidates based on the four criteria. A selection committee of five teachers makes the final selection of students to be inducted. Their selection is based on the teachers' voting.
