Special Feelings For Special People

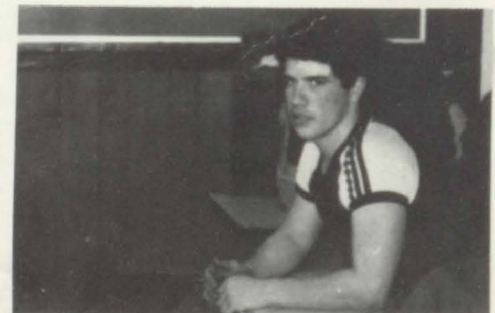
