Business And Fun Balance

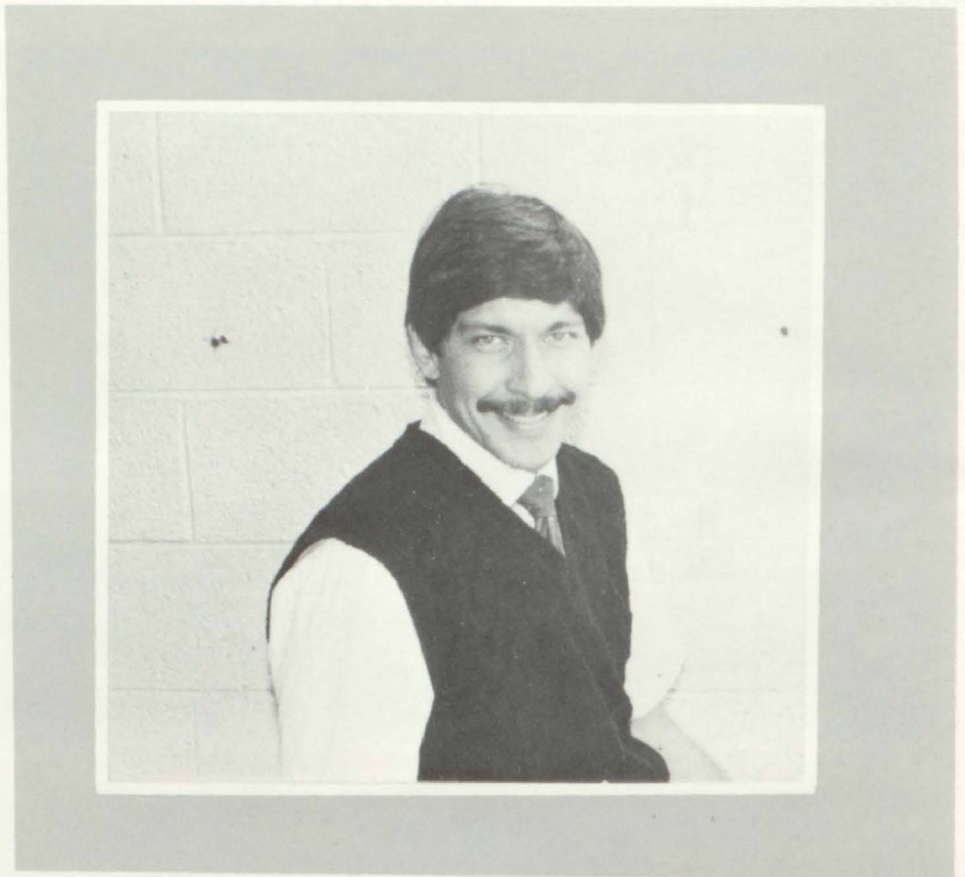
Moans of, "Mr. Hornak!" and the clicking of typewriters are only some of the many sounds which may be heard coming from 105, the business room.
