Through The Years

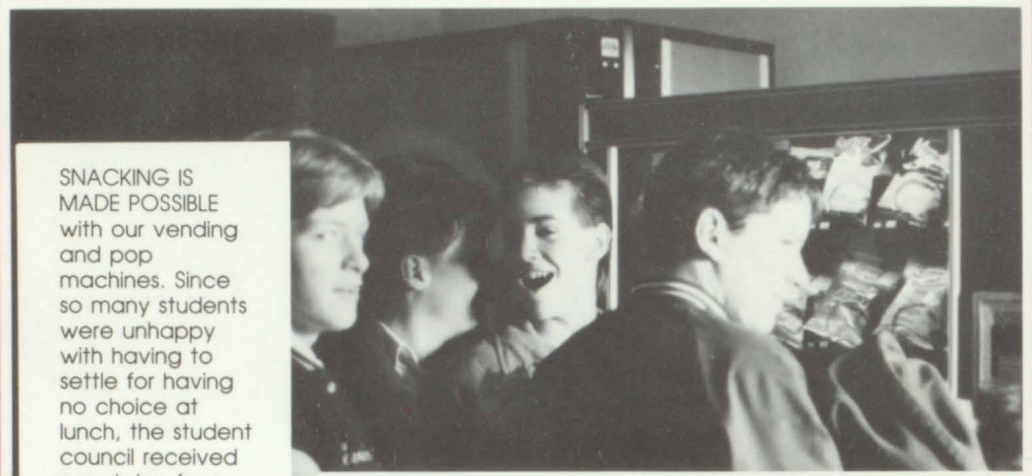
Hanging up the eighties may be a sad moment for some, but for others the prospect of the future is more valuable.
