It all started at Morrice when the team went in at half-time down by 7-6 but then won it, 12-7. Then a week later at Webberville, they went in at half-time 14-8, and came

back and won it 24-20.

But one of the biggest nights in Ashley football history was the Homecoming game against Dansville, Ashley kept the tradition of being down at halftime, 14-6, but they didn't quit and in the last thirty seconds won it, 22-21. Coach Sherm Hendricks later reflected, "It was the best game I've ever participated in. It started out exciting and it just got better." The Bears held Vestaburg at the one-half inch line to win.
