Ashley is a place where students participate in academics, extracurricular activities, and sports. In the frenzied atmosphere, few students can say that they are never busy.

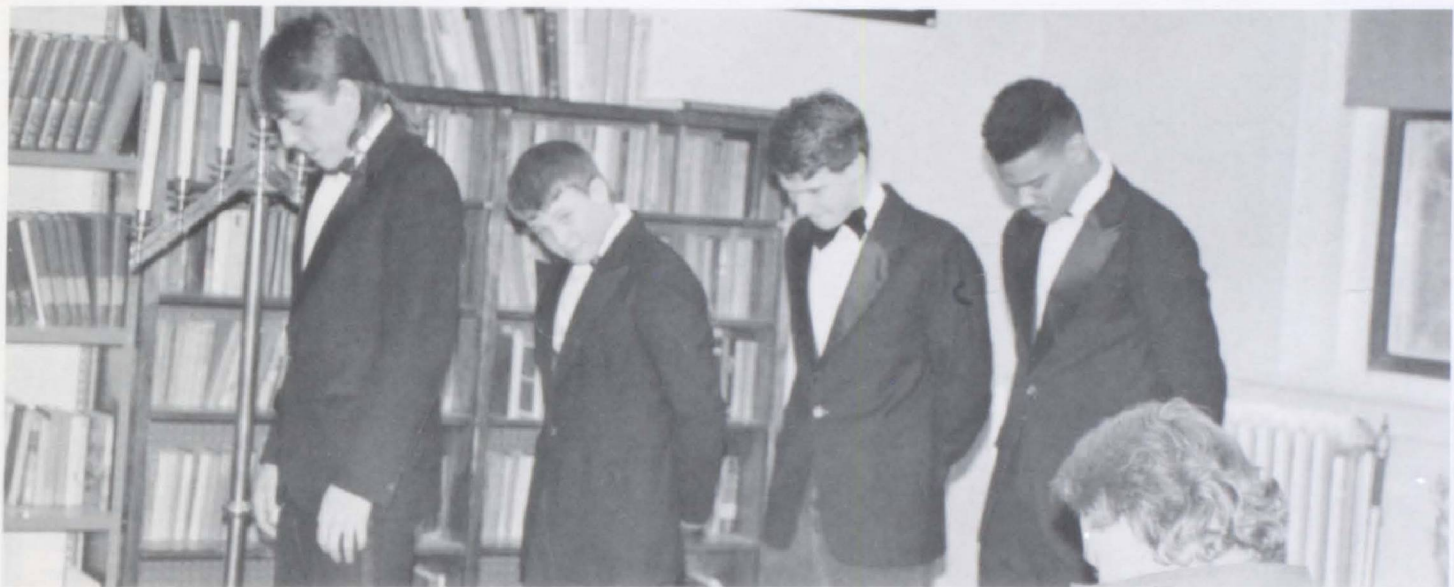
Have you ever felt that you had too much to do? A test in science, math, and social studies, and a pro-
