Joining the turn for good was the Future Homemakers of America. The FHA put on a Junior High Prom in the spring. This gave the younger students a special dance.



brarians and administrators turned to cadet teachers and office practice students to help in the classroom, offices, and in the library.


Groups like these have discovered an old secret: Doing something for someone else makes you feel good.
