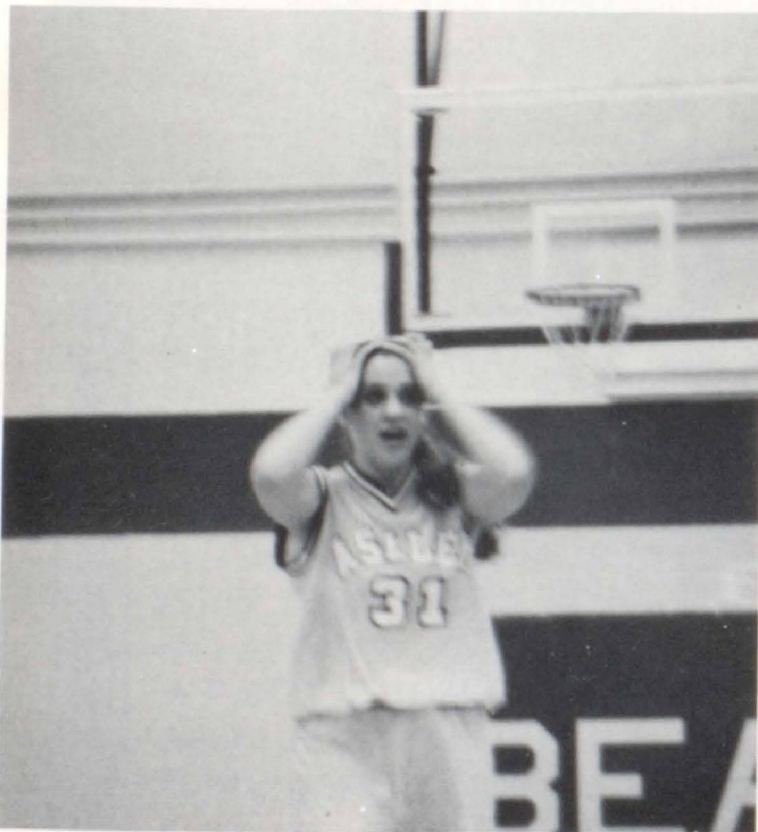
the JV girls started out 0-6 but then won the next 13 out of 14." It felt really good to see our hard work pay off," remarked tri-captain Brandie Burgett.
