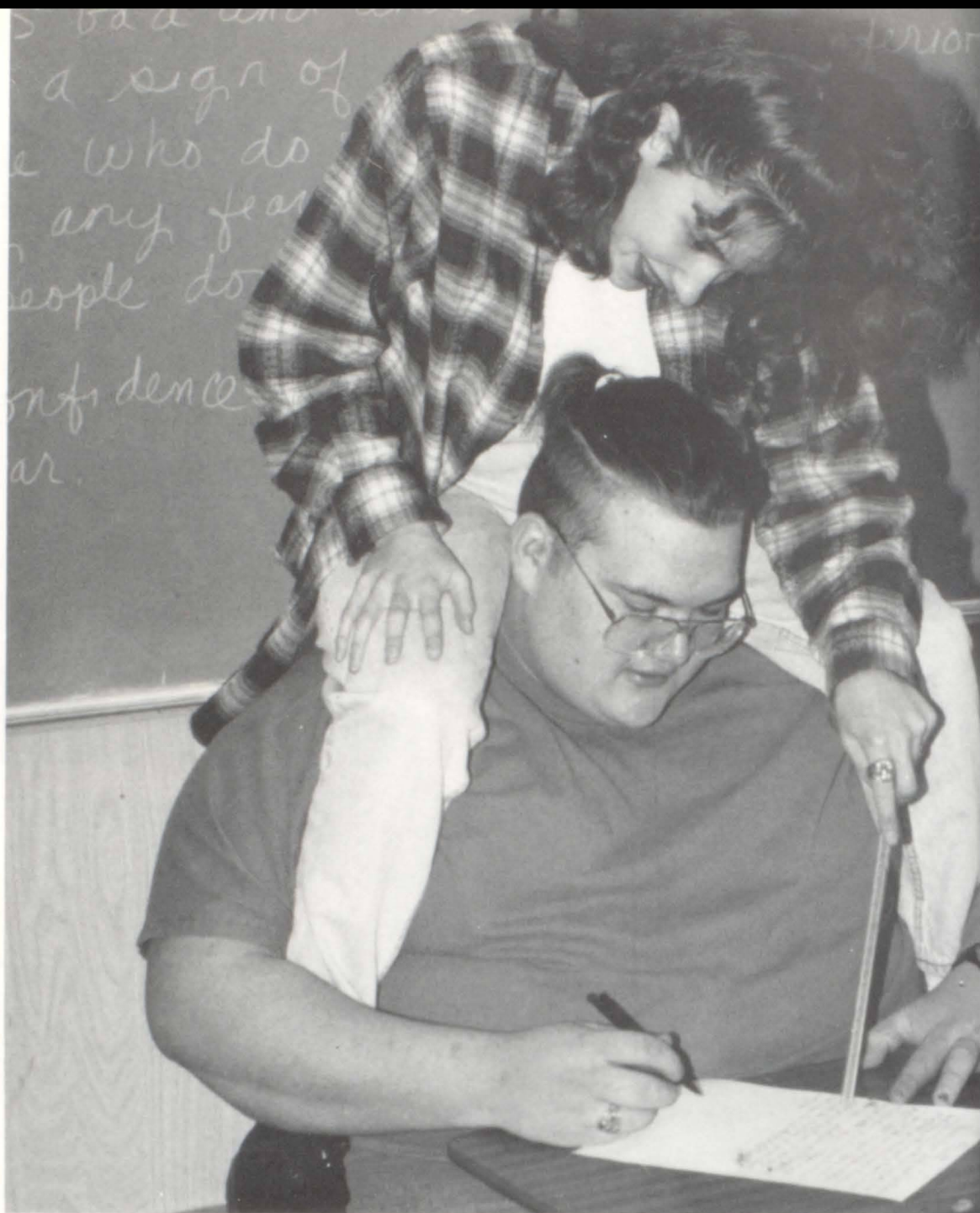
Journalism, English, Speech, Spanish. What do these classes mean at Ashley? They mean a group of great students and determined teachers out to have a good time while they learn.
