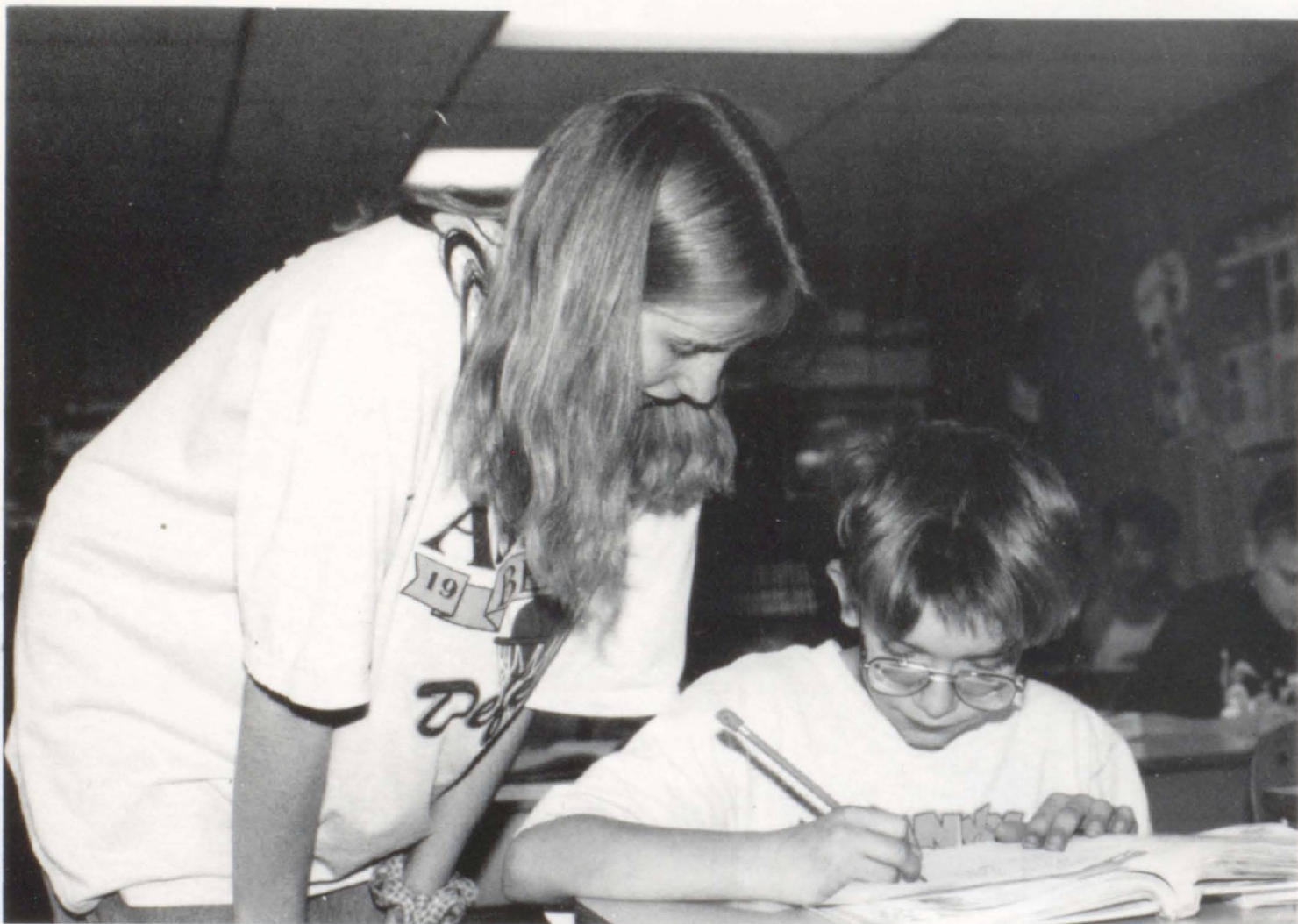
truly my 'right hand' people!" English teacher Mrs. Suzanne Luneack commented.
