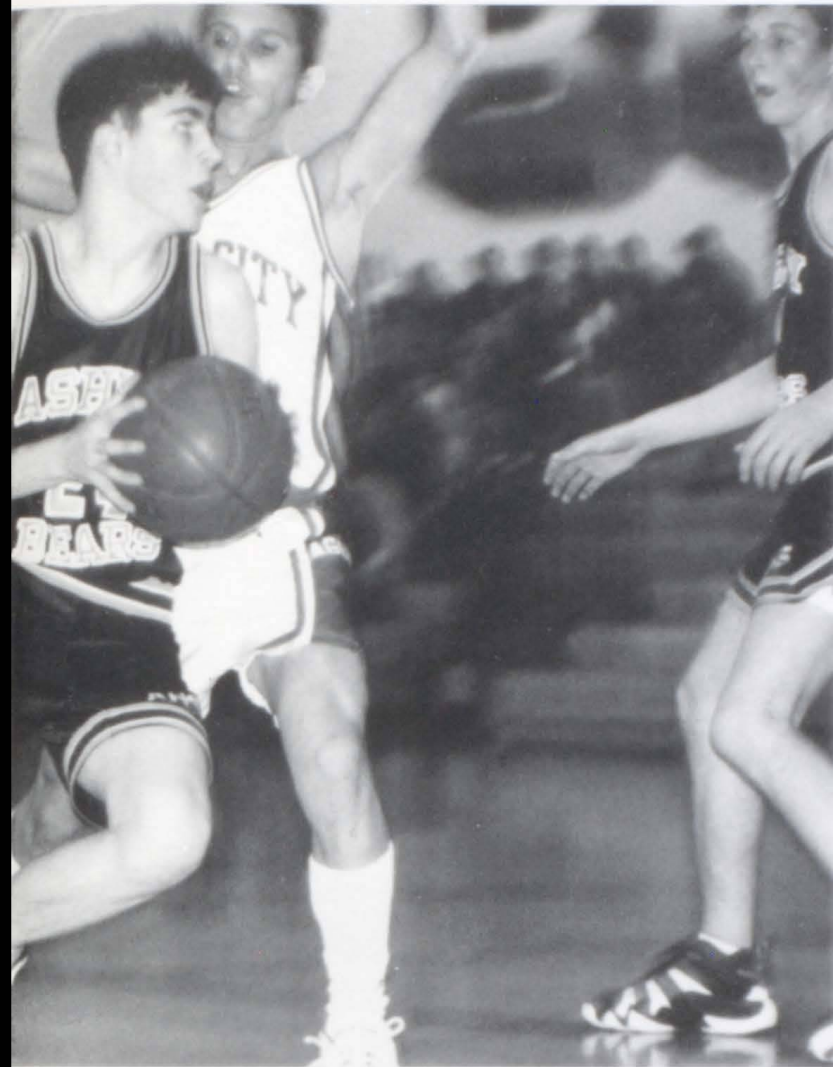


HELP! Aaron Grollimund looks for an open man against Beal City, while
