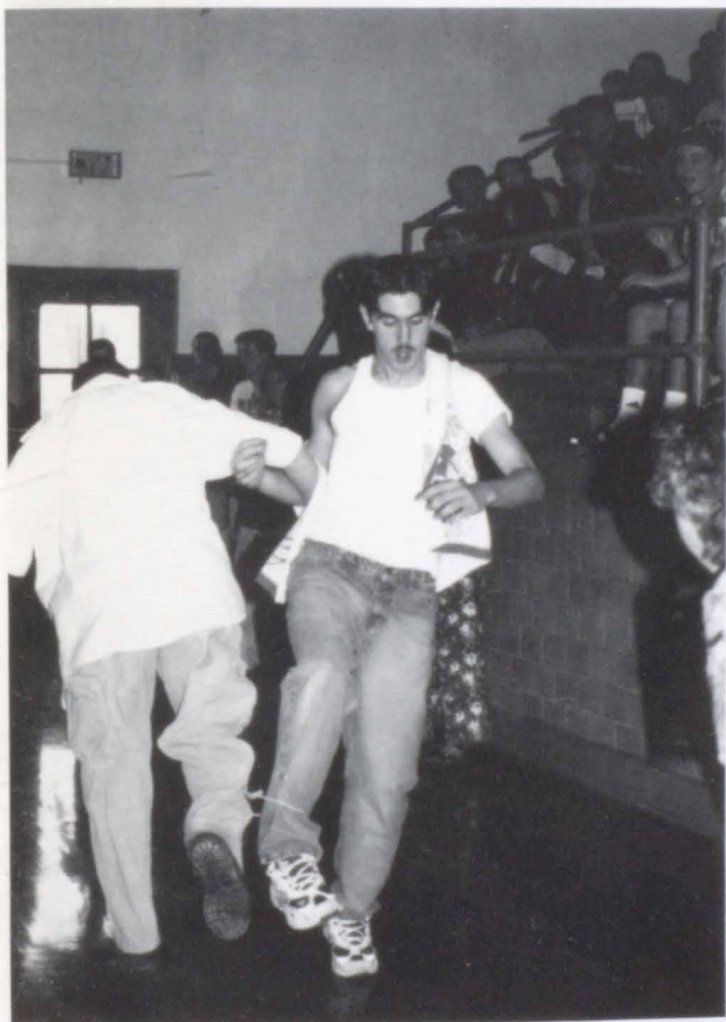
"I enjoy everything about being co-president except for the complaints I heard during Homecoming and Twirp Week," commented Lisa Strnad. "It made me feel like no-
