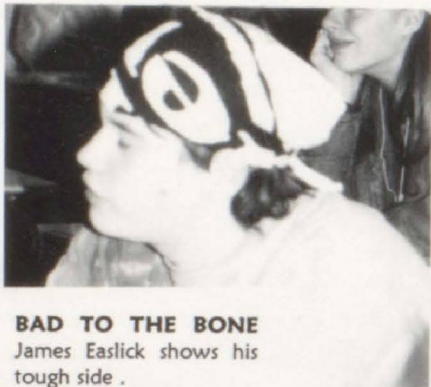


Party Time
