

"They didn't always work as a team." This statement, from JV Coach Sherry Reichard, seems to sum up the one disap-


pointment from both the junior high and JV teams.

JV's high points outweighed the low points. If either team would have worked together more, the disappointment would have been far less. Kari Deming




GOT IT Jessica Reist and Amanda Lange both go to bump the volleyball.
