"I feel I am a big contributor to SADD. I feel this way because I want to help people make the right and safe decisions when drinking. Don't drink and drive."

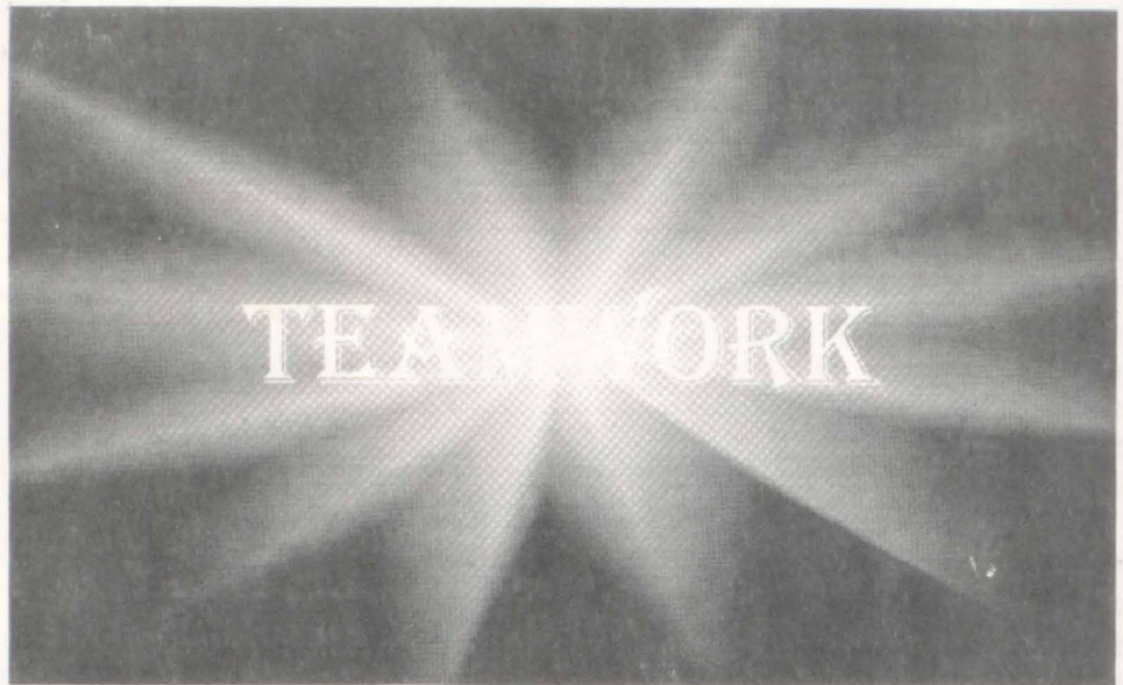
