Au revoir

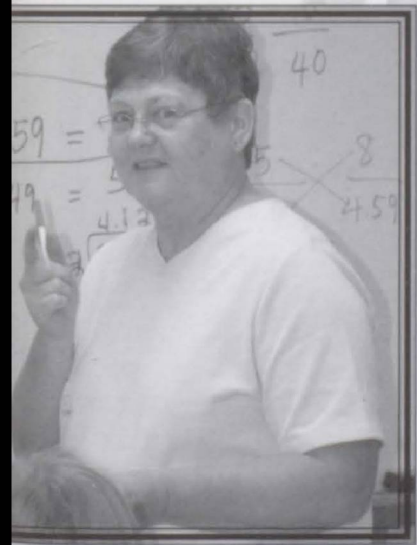
In the natural world, a strict order of events dictates everything that occurs in it. Included in this is the rise and fall of tides, bears' hibernation, length of the seasons, and the school year.
